## Announcing a Fine Arts Quartet January 27th concert!

Thanks to your enthusiastic response and support, the Fine Arts Quartet returns to Milwaukee for concerts in January and festival events July 14-18, 2019.

The Fine Arts Quartet will perform Sunday, January 27 at the Zelazo Center on the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee campus. The concert begins at 3:00 p.m. with a pre-talk scheduled for 2:00 p.m.

The Peck School of the Arts will again collaborate with the Friends to present this concert.

The entire concert will feature works by Ludwig van Beethoven, the great master of string quartets.

Beethoven's first quartet, his String Quartet in G major, Op. 18, No. 2 demonstrated an already mature technique, patterned after structures developed by Haydn and Mozart.

The last of his *Razumovsky* cycle of string quartets, String Quartet No. 9 in C major, Op. 59, No. 3, demonstrates how far Beethoven had come, as his personal style fully developed.

In addition, the Quartet will perform a brilliant but forgotten early work by Beethoven, the Präludium und Fuge in F (Hess 30), which he wrote for his teacher Johann Georg Albrechtsberger as an exercise in the counterpoint styles of Bach.

Fine Arts Quartet concerts in Milwaukee depend upon contributions from their many Milwaukee supporters.
